

- 1) If you have returned from the following Category 1 areas since February 19, call NHS111 to inform them of your recent travel, stay indoors at home and avoid contact with other people even if you do not have symptoms:
 - Iran
 - Specific 'lockdown' areas in Northern Italy: in the Lombardy Region: Bertinico, Casalpusterlengo, Castelgerundo, Castiglione D'Adda, Codogno, Fombio, Maleo, San Fiorano, Somaglia, Terranova dei Passerini and, in the Veneto Region: Vo . Other areas in Northern Italy north of Pisa are Category 2.
 - Daegu or Cheongdo (Republic of Korea). Other areas of South Korea are Category 2
 - Hubei province, China (returned in the past 14 days)

- 2) If you have returned from the following Category 2 areas since February 19th, you should stay indoors at home and avoid contact with other people and call NHS111 only if you develop symptoms. ('Symptoms' are flu symptoms such as cough, fever or shortness of breath, even if these are mild. If you have no symptoms you can continue coming to College as normal.)
 - Northern Italy, north of – but not including - Pisa, Florence and Rimini - (but not any of the 'lockdown' areas – see list and map link above)
 - Vietnam
 - Cambodia
 - Laos
 - Myanmar

Or If you have returned to the UK from any of the following areas in the last 14 days:

- Other parts of China outside Hubei province
- Thailand
- Japan
- Republic of Korea
- Hong Kong
- Taiwan
- Singapore
- Malaysia
- Macau

In any case where, following this advice, you are required to stay indoors at home and contact NHS 111, you need to email your Group Tutor (or the HR Manager in the case of staff) so that the College can be aware of anyone in this situation.

Currently we are aware of no one in Aquinas who falls into these categories. If this situation changes, and we become aware of people who have travelled to Category 1 areas, or even 'suspected' cases, Government advice currently remains very clear that they should be sent home but College should remain open. Only if there is a 'confirmed' case in our area will that advice change, and in that situation Public Health England will give all schools and colleges in Stockport specific advice, which will be communicated to all concerned. With regard to future college trips, Government advice does not currently warn against travel to, for example, Northern Italy (except for the specific towns listed above.) We will, however, carefully monitor the evolving situation. It is

always good practice to wash your hands regularly through the day, especially on arrival at College from public transport and in all the usual hygiene situations, with warm water and soap for at least 20s. We would like to reiterate that at present there are absolutely no indications of any issue at all with COVID-19 with any Aquinas students or staff whatsoever. Nonetheless, we wanted you all to be aware of the latest detailed Government advice, where to get updates as necessary, and what to do if you encounter any of these concerns.
